The Protective Factors: Concrete Support in Times of Need

The *Protective Factors* are strengths all families may have and can build upon that support resilient, thriving children and families. They are: parental resilience, social connections, knowledge of parenting & child development, concrete support in times of need, and social & emotional competence of children. These factors help to reduce stress, enhance wellbeing and positive parent-child relationships that are the foundation for healthy development in children. This month, our focus is on **concrete support in times of need**: having access to resources and services that provide a family's basic needs and reduce stress during challenging times.

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Concrete Supports may be:

- Food
- Clothing
- Housing
- Personal care items
- Financial assistance
- Medical or dental care
- Mental health services

March is National Reading Month!



March 2 is Read Across America Day in honor of Dr. Seuss' birthday, and the whole month of March is National Reading Month!

Read early and often to your children from day 1 to promote language development, empathy, curiosity, and a strong parent-child connection.

Birth-6 months

Babies love your soothing voice & exploring books with all of their senses. Board books are great!

Make connections between the story & your child's life - "The boy 2-3 years is playing in the snow, what do you like to do in the snow?

6-9 months

Offer short stories with colorful pictures, baby may start to recognize favorites

Your child may like to tell you 3-4 years the story now based on what is happening in the pictures

9-18 months

Ask your baby to point to familiar objects -"Where is the doggy?"

4-5 years

Your child's imagination is growing. They may make up their own stories & you can be their scribe!

18mos-2 years

For new talkers, try pausing before you say a favorite line to see if they will finish the phrase




Need a little recipe or meal-planning inspiration? Check out this 7-day meal plan with recipes from <u>yummytoddlerfood.com</u>

Helpful Tips:

- Want to reduce stress at meal-times? Remember this: you decide what is offered, your child decides how much to eat. Make sure to serve at least 1 food they usually like. Keep offering nutritious foods and they will learn to eat well in time
- Enjoy family meals around the table this promotes connection, language and social skills, and children are more likely to eat balanced meals when parents model healthy eating habits
- Encourage your child to assist in meal prep as much as possible while monitoring for safety
