The Protective Factors: Concrete Support in Times of Need

The Protective Factors are strengths all families may have and can build upon that support resilient, thriving children and families. They are: parental resilience, social connections, knowledge of parenting & child development, concrete support in times of need, social & emotional competence of children, and nurturing & attachment.

These factors help to reduce stress, enhance wellbeing and positive parent-child relationships that are the foundation for healthy development in children. This month, our focus is on **Concrete Support in Times of Need:** having access to resources and services that provide a family's basic needs and reduce stress during challenging times.



Childcare is a service that can help families meet their needs by allowing parents the time to work, attend school, and attend to daily tasks while their children are provided with safe and nurturing care from another caregiver. Childcare can be an essential need for many families to survive, and it can be a challenge to navigate picking the right provider for your family, paying for childcare, and juggling the daily routine.

Leelanau County has many dedicated, quality childcare providers, but there is a need for more as our area grows and the need for childcare outside of the home increases. To help with the process of finding the right childcare provider for your family, here are a few suggestions:

- Search online to find licensed providers in our area:
 - LARA (Michigan's licensing agency) – search by county & view detailed reports

- Great Start to Quality search for licensed providers with Great Start ratings greatstarttoquality.org
- Once you have selected a few you are interested in, call the provider to set up a visit to the home or facility to discuss any questions you have and get to know one another
- Many providers are currently on waitlists so put your name in as early as possible - even if you are pregnant and know you will need childcare in the near future

September is Car Seat Safety & Baby Safety Month

Types of Car Seats at a Glance		
Age-group	Type of Seat	General Guidelines
Infants and toddlers	Rear-facing-only or Rear-facing-convertible	All infants and toddlers should ride in a rear-facing seat until they reach the highest weight or height allowed by their car seat manufacturer. Most convertible seats have limits that will allow children to ride rear facing for 2 years or more.
Toddlers and preschoolers	Forward-facing convertible or Forward- facing with harness	Children who have outgrown the rear-facing weight or height limit for their convertible seat should use a forward-facing seat with a harness for as long as possible, up to the highest weight or height allowed by their car safety seat manufacturer. Many seats can accommodate children up to 65 pounds or more.
School-aged children	Booster	All children whose weight or height exceeds the forward-facing limit for their car safety seat should use a belt-positioning booster seat until the vehicle seat belt fits properly, typically when they have reached 4 feet 9 inches in height and are 8 to 12 years of age. All children younger than 13 years should ride in the back seat.
Older children	Seat belts	When children are old enough and large enough for the vehicle seat belt to fit them correctly, they should always use lap and shoulder seat belts for the best protection. All children younger than 13 years should ride in the back seat.

Rear-facing is the safest position for babies & young children! Make sure to follow your car seat's guidelines & once they meet the maximum height or weight limit, then they may forward-face.

Baby Safety Tips

- A firm mattress and fitted sheet are all you need for your baby's crib. Remove blankets and toys.
- Learn to use your child's car seat correctly. Take it to a certified car seat technician to ensure it is properly installed.
- Make sure you have both a working smoke alarm and a carbon monoxide alarm on every level of your home, and in all sleeping areas. Test the alarms to make sure they work. You can also call your local fire station for free installation of smoke alarms throughout your home.
- Place your baby's crib away from windows and blinds. Your baby is safer without any strings or cords within reach.
- Set your water heater to 120 degrees to avoid scalds.
