The Protective Factors: Concrete Support in Times of Need



STORIES INSIDE THIS ISSUE:

The Protective Factors are strengths all families may have and can build upon that support resilient, thriving children and families. They are: parental resilience, social connections, knowledge of parenting & child development, concrete support in times of need, social & emotional competence of children, and nurturing & attachment.

These factors help to reduce stress, enhance wellbeing and positive parent-child relationships that are the foundation for healthy development in children. This month, our focus is on **Concrete Support in Times of Need:** the resources and services that provide a family's basic needs and reduce stress during challenging times.

Upcoming Changes to Medicaid & Food Assistance Program

During the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic, changes were made to Medicaid eligibility to allow continuous coverage for people receiving Medicaid benefits and food assistance programs so that families would not lose health insurance and have extra food assistance during the public health emergency. Medicaid extended benefits are ending April 1, 2023 and Food Assistance Program extra benefits ended in February, so food assistance benefits will return to the pre-pandemic amount beginning in March. We understand that many families who rely on these benefits may be worried about how these changes will impact them and we're here to help.

Starting from April 1, 2023, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) will begin sending renewal information to the addresses they have on file. Renewal packets will go out one to two months before the month they are due. MDHHS plans to spread the renewals out over a year, so you may not get a renewal letter until 2024. You must respond to this renewal if you get it, or your Medicaid coverage will stop. (Michiganlegalhelp.org)

What families can do now:

- Login to <u>michigan.gov/mibridges</u> to make sure your contact information is correct. You may also wish to contact the local MDHHS office located in Traverse City: (231) 941–3900
- Check your mail for your renewal notice. Most people will need to submit documents for renewal once per year. You may also check online with your MI Bridges account to see what documents are required for verification and upload them directly in your MI Bridges account. Complete the verification process right away so you do not lose benefits for not responding within the window of time MDHHS requests verification.
- If you lose benefits, you can appeal the determination or reapply for benefits.

Reading as a Family

Reading helps children develop their early literacy skills – these include understanding language, beginning to communicate verbally, forming connections between pictures and words, recognizing familiar shapes and symbols, and so much more! 15 minutes a day of reading together can help your child learn, allows you quality time with your child, and encourages creativity.

Try these reading activities at home!

Look at books without words, or choose not to read the words and make up your own story! If your child is talking, ask them what they think is happening and make up a story together. If your child is not yet talking, describe what you see on the pages and invent a story of your own. It's a fun way to tell stories and add some creativity into our reading routine.


Visit your local library for story-time so that children can look at books with friends and explore a variety of books. Borrow a few books, return, & repeat! Getting new books each week is exciting and lets children explore new interests. Make a book with your child as the main character! Use construction paper to make a blank book and come up with a story featuring your child, then color the scenes on the pages and cut out photos of your child to glue in. Could your child be a superhero? Or an animal? Or take a trip to their favorite place? The possibilities are endless!


